KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That, _____ (“Grantor”), doing
 (Full name as registered with EIN/SS#)
 business under the laws of the State of _____, having a principal place of business at _____,

hereby constitutes and appoints TBB GLOBAL LOGISTICS, INC. (“TBB”), a Delaware Corporation, and its officers, employees, and/or specifically authorized agents, to act for and on Grantor’s behalf as a true and lawful agent and attorney of the Grantor for and in the name, place and stead of Grantor, from this date, in the United States and U.S. trade lanes (collectively the “territory”), whether as a customs broker, forwarding agent or for any other related activity: To make (either in writing, electronically or by other means), endorse, sign, declare, or swear to any entry, withdrawal, declaration, certificate, bill of lading, carnet or any other documents required by law, regulation or commercial practice in connection with the importation, exportation, transportation of any merchandise in or through the customs territory, shipped or consigned by or to Grantor; To perform any act or condition which may be required by law, regulation or commercial practice in connection with such merchandise deliverable to Grantor; To receive any merchandise deliverable to Grantor; To make endorsements on bills of lading conferring authority to transfer title; make entry or collect drawback; and to make, sign, declare, or swear to any statement or certificate required by law or regulation for drawback purposes, regardless of whether such document is intended for filing with Customs and Border Protection (“CBP”); To sign, seal, and deliver for and as the act of Grantor any bond required by law or regulation in connection with the entry or withdrawal of imported merchandise or merchandise exported with or without benefit of drawback, or in connection with the entry, clearance, lading, unlading or navigation of any vessel or other means of conveyance owned or operated by Grantor, and any and all bonds which may be voluntarily given and accepted under applicable laws and regulations, consignee’s and owner’s declarations provided for in section 485, Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, or affidavits or statements in connection with the entry of merchandise; To sign and swear to any document and to perform any act that may be necessary or required by law or regulation in connection with the entering, clearing, lading, unlading, or operation of any vessel or other means of conveyance owned or operated by Grantor; To authorize other customs brokers duly licensed within the territory to act as Grantor’s agent; To receive, endorse and collect checks issued for CBP duty refunds in Grantor’s name drawn on the Treasurer of the United States; To accept service of process on behalf of Grantor if the Grantor is a nonresident of the United States; To authorize other customs brokers duly licensed within the territory to act as subagents with power to perform the functions of the agent and to accept service of process on behalf of Grantor; To appoint an attorney at law on Grantor’s behalf to represent Grantor; To issue as agent and on behalf of Grantor powers of attorney on Customs Form 5291 or similar power of attorney forms to other customs brokers who are qualified residents of the United States; To receive copies of entries made on Grantor’s behalf from customs brokers so appointed; To receive and pay as agent of Grantor invoices from customs brokers so appointed for fees and charges incurred pursuant to such appointment, Grantor explicitly waiving the right to receive copies of entries or invoices directly from the customs brokers so appointed, but retaining the right to receive copies of such entries or invoices from TBB; And generally To transact customs business, including filing of claims or protests under section 514 of the Tariff Act of 1930, or pursuant to other laws within the territory, in which Grantor is or may be concerned or interested and which may properly be transacted or performed by an agent and attorney, giving to such agent and attorney full power and authority to do anything whatever requisite necessary to be done in the premises as fully as Grantor could do if present and acting, hereby ratifying and confirming all that such agent and attorney shall lawfully do by virtue of these presents. This power of attorney to remain in full force and effect until revocation in writing is duly given to and received by TBB. In the event that Grantor is a partnership this Power of Attorney shall be of no force or effect after the expiration of two years from the execution of this document. Grantor acknowledges receipt of TBB’s International Terms and Conditions of Service governing transactions between Grantor and TBB, as may be amended, and agrees to abide by such Terms and Conditions including the limitation of liability contained therein. Such Terms and Conditions may also be found on TBB’s website, www.tbbgl.com. The signatory certifies that he/she has full authority to execute this document on behalf of Grantor.

ADVISORY STATEMENT

If you are the importer of record, payment to the broker will not relieve you of liability for CBP charges (duties, taxes or other debts owed Customs) in the event the charges are not paid by the broker. Therefore, if you pay by check, CBP charges may be paid with a separate check payable to the “Bureau of Customs and Border Protection” which shall be delivered to CBP by the broker. Importers who wish to utilize this procedure must contact the TBB office in advance to arrange timely receipt of duty checks.
